The Bond Oversight Committee (BOC) is a group of concerned citizens who provide insight of the bond program from a community perspective.

This committee's roles and responsibilities are:

- To interface with the Bond Management team (the group of Thompson School District staff members who also provide oversight of the bond program from a District perspective) and the Board of Education.
- To provide quality feedback to the Bond Management team on community feedback
- To meet quarterly to review bond project lists, review timelines and discuss an overview of what projects have been completed
- To assure that new construction and maintenance projects listed in the 2005 bond are accomplished
- Provide accountability of expenditures and safeguard the public trust that projects listed in the bond referendum are completed and on schedule, or disclose why they are not.
- Review projects, scope and scheduling
- Comment and make recommendations to the Board of Education
- Provide feedback for proposed change initiatives
- Provide updates to public
